

# Let It Snow, Man!

## October Block by Lois H. a/k/a Losi53

### Pieced Background Instructions:

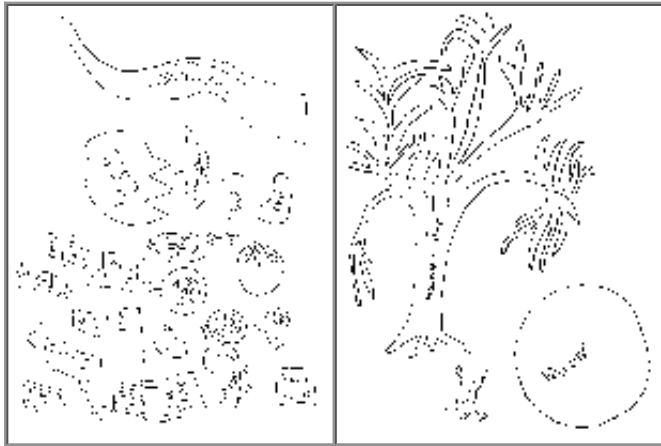
Put the sky fabric on a cutting mat and place the grass fabric on top about 7" down from the top of the sky. With a rotary cutter, cut a gentle curve through both layers and stitch them together by machine. These are easy curves and can be stitched slowly, matching the raw edges as you go along. Repeat the process by putting the sidewalk fabric about 10 1/2" from the top, cutting another curve through the two fabrics and then stitch the sidewalk to the grass. Press both seams toward the grass fabric. This gives the illusion that the sky is behind the grass and the grass is covering the edge of the sidewalk. The fabric measurements are generous enough so the block can be trimmed to 12 1/2" x 12 1/2".

Your finished measurements may differ from mine, depending on how you cut the curves and how you square up the block. It really doesn't matter, as long as you have sky, grass and sidewalk.

Below are the templates for October's block. Remember you will need Adobe Acrobat Reader to view and print the templates. If you do not have Adobe Acrobat Reader, click the button at the bottom of this page for the download direct from Adobe. It is a free download. Click on each picture to download the file to your computer. You can then print it out or save a copy to your computer to print later.

When printing these templates, be sure that **"Page Scaling"** is set to NONE and the check boxes for **"Auto-Rotate and Center"** and **"Choose Paper Source by PDF Page Size"** are UNCHECKED.
