

# Let It Snow, Man!

## November Block by Eva P. a/k/a Newfiegal\_1

### The First Settlers

#### Fabric suggestions:

Blue for sky (13" square)  
Beige for ground (4 X 13")  
White print for snow people's bodies,  
and heads  
Purple/Pink print for lady's jacket and  
hat  
Greens for scarf, mittens, jacket & hat  
trim  
Dark Gray for pie pan  
Orange print for noses and pumpkin  
pie top  
Cream for shoulder and arm cuffs  
Black for hat and mittens  
Gold for hat buckle  
Browns for gun and turkey bodies  
assorted reds, oranges, and greens  
for tail feathers

#### Other items :

Template material  
Fusible webbing if desired  
White Buttons for jackets  
Embroidery floss; black, orange, white  
and burgundy



#### Designer's Notes:

If you are going to appliqué add your usual 1/8 - 1/4" turn under to the templates. If you are fusing, cut out the templates as they are, following manufacturer's fusible web instructions. The templates have been traced in reverse for you, but you will need to trace the second turkey in reverse. Decorative blanket stitching or machine stitching will be needed on those raw edges.

The templates are listed alphabetically from A - X, in the order in which they are applied to the background fabrics. Most dashed lines pieces are underneath another piece, except the hats, these lines are either top stitched in another color or for the hat trim.

The snow couple is situated (2") from the bottom edge, leaving room for the turkey placements. I machine stitched (satin stitch) twice around the gold hat buckle to give it a more pronounced look,

### **Instructions:**

1. Cut the sky background block 13" square. This will be trimmed down to 12 ½" after the appliqué pieces have been added and the block is finished..
2. Add the beige ground piece next, which is roughly 4" X 13", cutting it somewhat wavy giving it a softer and natural look.
3. Add the template pieces in alphabetical order, stitching as you go on the solid lines.
4. Detail the facial features on the snow people with the embroidery floss, black for the eyes and mouth, burnt orange for the turkey legs and beaks, white for their eyes, black for the gun's trigger, and burgundy for the worm. Stitch around hat buck (see Designer's Notes) and add the buttons to the jackets.
5. Trim the finished block to 12 1/2".

**Change anything you wish to make this block yours.
